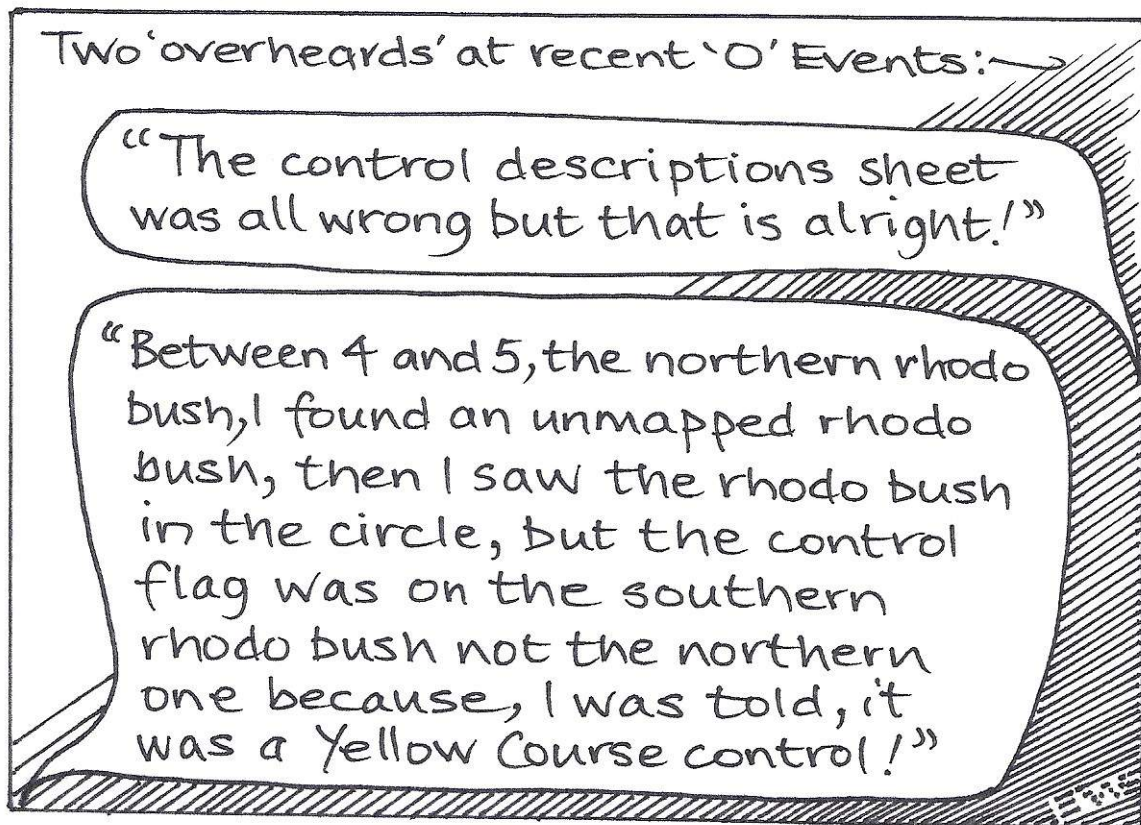

Report on East Midlands Meeting – 20th October 2014

Appointment of Chair / Vice- Chair – John Hurley, as Vice-Chair, asked if there had been any other volunteers from the clubs to fill in the post of Chair. As no-one had come forward John volunteered to fill the role John said he would fill the role. Amanda Roberts felt she was not experienced enough for Chair but was willing to fill in as Vice-Chair. The committee thanked them both for stepping in to the roles.

Junior Squad – The Junior Squad have already attended the Junior InterRegional Champs (see report later in EMEWS) and are about to attend the Hawkshead Training camp. These are the 2 events which normally use most of the budget for the year. The meeting therefore requested the Junior Squad to ensure that all activities for the remainder of the year be self-sustaining. One thing the Squad will be doing is having a cake stall to help fund their activities at some of the future events. It was also identified that we had sold a number of junior squad O-tops, so we did want to establish how much stock we have.

Junior Squad Building Society Account – At the AGM the state of the Junior Squad Building Society Account was not known. The Account is still in place with £800.

Planners/Controllers Conference – The event took place on October 4th and had 23 regional attendees. We would like to encourage a wider attendance as the aim is always to improve the quality of EMOA events. So Chris Phillips asked the following questions of the club reps (and would welcome any input from all members). Do we want to repeat the event, and if we do, should we change the format at all? How do we get folk to attend who don't normally attend? Should we even change the target group so as to include inexperienced planners?

Regional Training Day – This event is next scheduled for the end of 2015. Again Chris Phillips asked for feedback on the format of the event. Do we still want to run it? Do we want the usual courses? Are there any other courses that people want to see? Again feedback to Chris.

Development Officer Job Description – Chris stated there is no formal job description for the role of Development Officer. He asked what clubs and members wanted to be included in his role. Again any feedback to Chris.

Coaching Development – Hilary Palmer reported that EMOA have 1 new level 2 coach. There are also 4 more level 2 coaches to be assessed by the end of the year. There is a level 2 coaching course coming up at the end of January and Hilary still has a space on it. If anyone has any other names please contact Hilary. In addition the committee agreed to fund Hilary's attendance at the National Coaching Conference. Hilary asked clubs to support any of their coaches in attending.

Fixtures:

- a. **EMOA League 2014** – All going well currently, only issue is that NOC are struggling to get a controller for Walesby.
- b. **EMOA League 2015** – So far have 15 events identified. At present DVO are missing any events in the autumn.

- c. **2014 Urban League** - All going OK. Final event scheduled for Oakwood.
- d. **2015 Urban League** - Have this almost fully defined with 8 events for 2015.
- e. **EMOA Night League** - Paul has still to define rules for a Night League. Some events have already taken place so may need to wait to start properly to next year.

Future Events:

- (i) **29 November 2014 - EM Sprint Champs - Abbotsholme (DVO)** - All planning underway
- (ii) **15 March 2015 CompassSport Cup (NOC) at Sherwood Pines** - still require a controller (are there any volunteers out there?)
- (iii) **Yvette Baker Trophy Round in 2015** - Committee proposed the DVO Event at Kedleston Park in March for this.
- (iv) **29 November 2015 - East Midlands Champs 2015** - Birchens Edge (DVO)
- (v) **27 February 2016 - British Night Champs 2016 (LEI)** - Terrain assessment and risk assessment complete. Mapping currently underway.
- (vi) **28 February 2016 - Midlands Champs 2016 (NOC)** - NOC still need to define officials.

Future Possible Events

- i) **British School Score Champs 2017** - Bradgate has been proposed as a venue.
- ii) **Junior Inter-Regional Champs 2018** - EMOA are scheduled to host this. If any members have access to school facilities (or other buildings) that could be used to host the junior squads for the night could they contact one of the EMOA Committee.
- iii) **Midland Champs 2018** - LEI have an area they wish to use.
- iv) **British Sprints / Middles 2019** - Still looking for possible areas.
- v) **British / British Relays** - We are down to host. Do we have possible areas? Should we host or ask to use another region's areas?

Red Bull Event - The situation as regards the Red Bull Event to be held in Sherwood Pines was discussed. The actual series of events were that Red Bull approached the Forestry Commission about the event (they have a Director in Switzerland who is an orienteer). The Forestry Commission agreed to the event. They then approached NOC Chairman who requested them to talk to British Orienteering. As Red Bull and Forestry Commission wanted to go ahead whatever NOC agreed to get involved in helping put on the event

Future Meetings - All meetings to be held at the Pace Room, St Mary's Church, Clifton Village, Nottinghamshire at 7.30 p.m. The next committee meeting is Monday 26th January. As always members are welcome to attend.

Alan Beardsley 1948 - 2014

It was with a sense of shock and loss that we learnt of Alan Beardsley's death from a suspected stroke. Alan had been a stalwart member of NOC for 30 years and carried out every role - planner, controller, helper in all areas and especially from my point of view as one of NOC's reliable team of mappers.

Alan was quiet, self-deprecating, always willing to help and one of the nicest guys you will come across. He was a regular at the Scottish Six Days "NOC house party" and on the wider front will be remembered for putting together the annual photo competition in CompassSport magazine. He was excellent at general knowledge quizzes and written and verbal word games

For me as a fellow age-class competitor he was one to try to beat. As a mapper Alan was responsible for updating many of NOC's maps including on several occasions Sherwood Forest and most recently Clumber Park for the Robin Hood Trophy in 2014. At the other end of the scale he has mapped scores of schools across Nottinghamshire and as planner produced some of NOC's most memorable competitions.

I remember the first time he appeared, it was after a summer weekday evening event at Vicar Water, one of the first held there, and we had retired to the pub in Old Clipstone to discuss a certain route choice, over, around or under a railway embankment. It became clear that this quiet stranger was going to be here to stay. Before long he expressed an interest in mapping and has been involved continually since.

Alan was a teacher at Sutton Centre where he introduced orienteering, did coaching with a number of students and quite often took a mini bus of students to events until he retired in 2002. From 1971 to 1974 he taught in Africa in Zambia at a remote boarding school in the village of Sesheke on the banks of the Zambesi. In addition to nearly 30 years orienteering, for the same length of time he was a National Park ranger based in the Peak Park at Fairholmes. Sadly it was here on Saturday 26th July that he was taken ill.

We will miss him.

EMOA Junior Orienteering Squad Punches above its Weight at Inter-Regional Competition

The weekend of 27th/28th September saw 17 juniors from NOC, LEI, LOG and DVO represent the EMOA at the annual junior inter-regional competition (JIRCS) hosted this year by Northwest OA. Individual races were held in the rather unforgiving Grizedale Forest, while the relays were on the technical but otherwise delightful Roanhead sand dunes. Finn Lydon, Anna Barber and Gabriel Rawlinson starred for EMOA at the individuals with excellent top-ten positions. The very technical relay area caused a few mis-punches and two teams were disqualified but again we saw some good runs from Finn Lydon, Hannah Cox, Imogen Wilson (running up as a W16) and Elizabeth Bedwell (running up as W18). A strong

set of runs from an incomplete team secured the EMOA team 7th place out of the 12 regions; a good result for a small region.

The Junior Squad organises a number of training sessions through the year, using local areas and some further afield to give our developing athletes more experience in varied championship terrain. It is clear that the regions that do best spend a lot of time training on the top areas in the country. If we're to give our juniors the opportunities to compete on similar terrain then we need transport, and this is rather expensive.

If anyone has access to an affordable source of minibuses that could be used for squad transportation for e.g. a training weekend in South Wales or the Lake District then the squad coaching team would really like to hear from you.

Many thanks go to the EMOA for its financial support towards the costs of representing the region at the inter-regional competition.

Finn Lydon Trossachs Camp Report 2014 - 25th Aug 2014

Firstly, I would like to thank Leicestershire Orienteering Club and Roger Edwards and East Midlands Orienteering Association and Mark Webster, for giving me funding to pay for the costs of the week tour.

The week started off with an early start in order to catch the train from Leicester to Stirling. During this train ride I had to make three stops but unfortunately I managed to miss the train at my first stop, however this was not my fault. Luckily everything else from there on went smoothly and I was able to get to Stirling only an hour late.

At Stirling station, a very kind man who goes by the name of Don, kindly picked me up and drove me to the accommodation. As soon as I had arrived, I was told to put on some running gear ready for a training session but first I was shown to my room and there I met my awesome room-mates. Luckily I knew most of the people in the room so I was able to chat freely whilst getting ready. We then were told what we were doing, in the main room. First we did a warm up which included static and dynamic stretches followed by a 60 metre sprint. This sprint was timed to see who was the fastest at the start of the week. However after this first sprint we had to do the same again but blindfolded. It was challenging to say the least but very, very funny when people started running off in the wrong direction and tripping over. Most members of the group managed to do this successfully however. After all this we did an orienteering course, in pairs, around the woods near to the accommodation.

Monday: On the first day of training we went to an area called Sauchie Crag & Polmaise. In this area we visited both the north and the south because there were two different maps. We did normal orienteering courses which did not focus on specific techniques. In the north part of the area the course went through open woodland with thick rhododendron bushes and plenty of minor paths. This area was quick running but hard to get through the thick bushes. In the South area it was mainly the same, apart from the huge clumps of bushes instead of the little ones. However undergrowth was a tiny problem as both areas hardly had any which meant it was easy running.

Tuesday: On the second day of training we went to the Trossachs. The Trossachs was a hilly, wooded area with open boggy patches and was covered in bracken (most of which were above head height). Once there, we had to ascend a 100m climb up to the assembly point and from there we were given a choice of 6 courses to complete, however I only managed to do 4. Each course challenged you on coping with varied length legs, route choices and physicality. No one completed all courses but everyone managed to complete 3 or more.

Wednesday: On Wednesday we firstly went to a hilly moor called Dumyat. There we did usual courses but were told to focus on contouring round and using main features such as hill tops, spurs and re-entrants as attack points. The area was fully open with no trees or bushes which meant it was easier to use the techniques that were told to use. After that training we travelled to Stirling University to do a "Mixed Sprint Relay." It was a mass start and everyone had separate gaffles. The gaffles varied from 2.5km to 2.9km in length depending on the

capability of the athlete. The courses started in the middle of a grassy opening and then went into the woodlands behind the university. Most of the controls were not hard to find. Once I had got the controls within the woods (there were only 3) the course brought you through a cluster of buildings and over a long bridge over to the other side of the campus. We then did a loop and came back to the finish.

For the rest of the day we went shopping and messed about 'til it was time to do the night O. We gathered our O gear and set out to the area at 9pm. The area we did night O in was called Barr Wood. In daylight, this area is fairly easy to navigate around but when it is night, it is much harder. We only did one course in this area and by the time we were finished it was around 1:00am (in the morning).

Thursday: On Thursday we went to a place called Fairy Knowe. Most of the courses were focusing on long legs. Most of the legs were using paths which ran from one side of the map to the other. This made it easy to travel around the dense, thick undergrowth which covered most of the area. After this we travelled to another area to do the middle distance race. This area had open forests but had lots of bracken.

Friday: The last day of training was the 'tour champs'. This was held in the Trossachs. Each gender group had their own course. The "Mens" course was 4.4km long but had 470m of climb. The course ran you throughout the whole of the area showing off its beautiful, natural features. The winning time was around 60 minutes however I managed to complete it in around 120 minutes due to a couple of mess ups (my fault).

The friends I made, lots of them Scottish, the accommodation and The Trossachs area itself and the coaches were absolutely brilliant. Thank you to Jonny Malley and Jet Orr for being brilliant with me all week and of course Iain Embrey who organised such a fantastic tour. Overall I loved this tour and would recommend it to anyone who gets the chance to get on it.

The British Team for this event amounted to 9 people, and the Midlands Regions were well represented with HOC members David Williams and Robert Vickers, plus Bob Titterington and John Marriott from LEI. Before the question is asked, the Team members were all entirely self-funded.

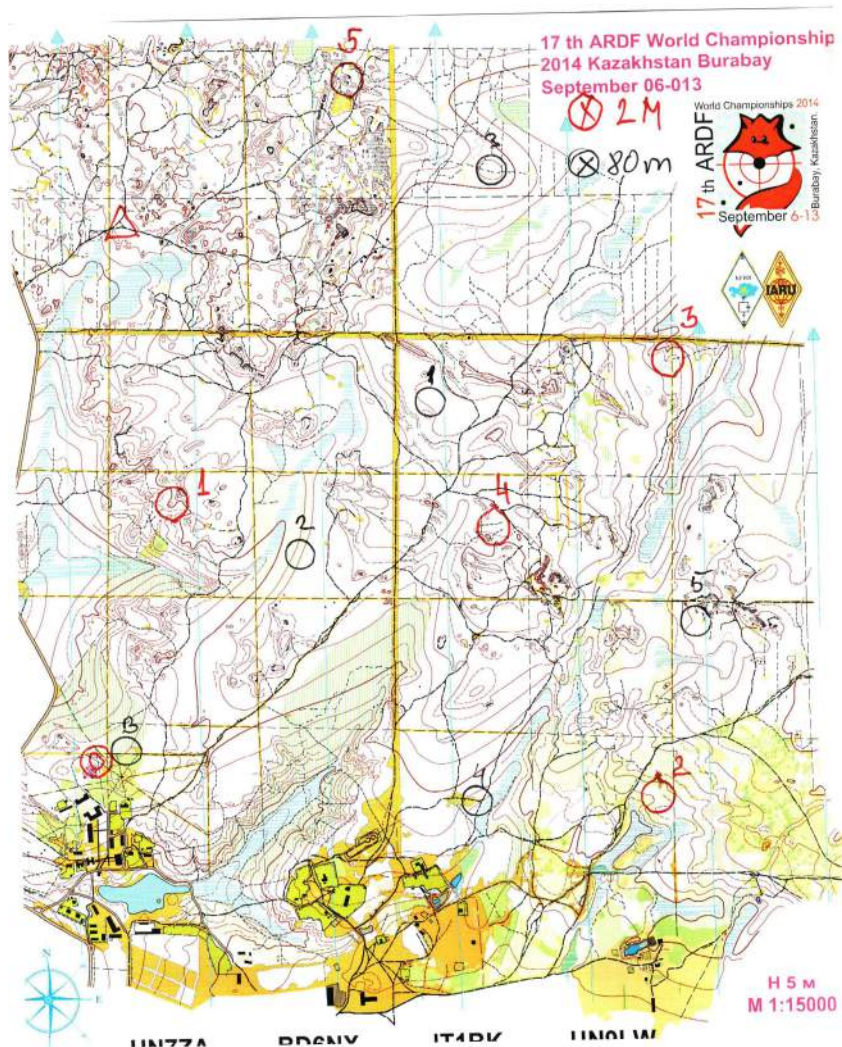

These World Championships are held every two years, under the auspices of Amateur Radio organisations rather than IOF - since radio direction finding techniques are required to locate the control sites (small radio transmitters) as well as run round them as quickly as possible. Like conventional orienteering, participants run in "Age Classes" and the number of transmitters (and their arrangement) allows courses of different lengths to be devised. In the intervening years, European Regional Champs take place instead, though the level of competition is just as fierce since the European nations predominate.

The event centre was in Burabay, the best part of a 4 hour bus journey from the airport serving the capital city, Astana. The two places were connected by an excellent, and almost traffic free, 6-lane motorway which crossed seemingly endless tracts of featureless steppe,

barely interrupted by an occasional cluster of modest houses and groups of cattle. Not much prospect of any decent orienteering here: until eventually arriving at Burabay which turned out to be a smallish town on the shores of an attractive lake, surrounded by significant hills. They call it the "Kazakh Switzerland" though this might be a slightly ambitious claim. However, after all those miles of steppe, what joy to be greeted by the most gorgeous pine forests, marked by rocky outcrops and the cleanest forest floor imaginable. The latter is no doubt helped by the harshest of winter temperatures. Fortunately, the September temperature is a lot kinder, albeit a bitter gusty wind with accompanying periods of rain through the middle of the week did make us glad that we had packed some Hellies and other winter gear, in case of such emergencies.

It is around 20 years since the first British competitors began to attend these events and started learning how to develop the necessary techniques, and in those early days it seemed that the podium was always destined to remain far out of our reach. Gradually however, more

runners were recruited (largely from the traditional O-clubs) and the Brits began moving up the results lists - with Bob Titterington breaking the mould by winning M70 gold for 80 metres (the radio wavelength, not the distance!) in 2012. The British presence was reinforced in 2013, with a "sprint race" gold medal for Robert Vickers and a M70 team silver coming back home from the European Champs. But this year, our podium presence was reinforced yet again, ensuring that Great Britain is now recognised as a significant player in this sport. David Williams made a notable breakthrough winning silver for 2 metres - and this in M50, which is a highly competitive class in these events. Furthermore, in the same race, Robert Vickers also collected M70 silver. The other British M70, Bob, had a good run too which resulted in an aggregate result giving a team silver. Four podium appearances for Midland Brits from one day's events! This was not the end of the Union Jack's visits to the podium however, since the M70s collected a further team silver on one of the other days for the 80 metre event.

So what are the abiding memories of our week in this distant land, of which we know so little? Vast open spaces with a sparse population; a brand new capital city (Astana) with spectacular modern architecture; a delightful lake surrounded by hills and superb forests. An organisation with obviously limited human resources struggling bravely to put on a prestigious event, but inevitably leaving a lot of gaps. Importantly

though, the actual competitions running almost faultlessly - despite inexperience showing in some aspects of the planning. Good maps, but lacking details of the mappers. Decent hotel accommodation and catering - but scattered over some kilometres so that "getting together" was a frequent problem, with constant uncertainty about transport arrangements exacerbated by inadequacy of information arrangements. The value of a single Russian speaker in our team, since so few local Kazakh people spoke any western languages. All in all a memorable experience which will be cherished for a long time by those taking part.

MINUTES OF THE 50th ANNUAL GENERAL MEETING AND ASSOCIATED EGM OF THE EAST MIDLANDS ORIENTEERING ASSOCIATION HELD ON MONDAY 15th September 2014 at Clifton, Nottingham at 19.30.

1. **Apologies for absence:** Apologies were received from Bob Alderson (NOC) and Judith Holt (DVO).
2. **Minutes of the 49th AGM held on Monday 16th September 2013.** It was agreed that the minutes were a true record as proposed by Ernie Williams (LEI) and seconded by John Hurley (DVO).
3. **Proposed Standing Order Change.** There were no standing order changes to be discussed.
4. **Chairman's Report**

Firstly I would like to thank my three other Principal Officers: John Hurley (DVO) who has provided eagle-eyed scrutiny of the minutes as well as providing a historical memory better than mine; Mark Webster (NOC) who has taken on the Financial Secretary role at a time when we need to look, in particular, at how we fund the Junior Squad and other developmental activities; and Chris Phillips who took on the Development Co-ordinator's role at a time when he has many other major commitments within orienteering both nationally and locally. My thanks to all three.

My thanks also to other officers, including the Club Representatives - Mike Gardner (DVO), Bob Haskins (LEI), Amanda Roberts (LOG) and Pauline Olivant (NOC). Mike also produced the minutes of our meetings and compiled EMEWS regularly for us. Others with specific roles included Paul Beresford (Fixtures), David Olivant (Mapping), Hilary Palmer (Coaching), John Cooke (Webmaster), Ursula Williamson (EMOA League), Paul Murgatroyd (Urban League), Richard Robinson (Junior Squad) and Roy Denney (National Forest). Judith Holt and John Woodall, our President, also attended regularly as British Orienteering Directors.

All four clubs have continued to provide a regular series of events as part of the EMOA League and urban league as well as large numbers of Level D events and other activities.

Major activities during the year including LEI successfully putting on Day 3 of the JK in South Wales, with assistance from the other clubs. This was a major undertaking and was not helped by the weather on the day but otherwise went very well. DVO put on the British Schools Championships at Shipley Park in November and East Midlands Championships were put on by LEI at Spring Cottage in November 2013 and at Cademan and Thringstone Wood in April this year.

On the development side we ran another successful training and development day on 1st March. Subsequent discussion has been about whether we should run this day every year or every eighteen months. We will be running the next conference for experienced planners and controllers on Saturday 4th October at Rushcliffe Country Park. Barry Elkington and Roger Edwards will be running sessions and I would encourage all the relevant people to join us - it's free, including lunch.

We have also provided funding for juniors to take part in training camps and tours on condition that they write an article for EMEWS.

Personally, I feel that the EMOA continues to perform a useful function, although I know that not everyone feels this way. The Development Plan contains items supporting clubs, members (particularly juniors) and events across the region. If nothing else, getting representatives from all four clubs to sit round a table four times a year to discuss the health and future of orienteering in our region has to be a good thing. Collaborating is also going to produce better outcomes which in the end means better, more enjoyable orienteering for us all.

This time last year I agreed to take on the Chair's role for one year whilst an attempt was made to find a replacement. Unfortunately, we have been unable to find anyone and, unless someone comes forward at this meeting or by the next committee meeting, we are going to be without a Chair. John Hurley agreed to be Vice

Chair on the understanding that he would not become Chair. It is not an onerous job as the main business of the Committee comes from the Development Plan, which is developed by the committee as a whole under the guidance of the Development Co-ordinator, Chris Phillips.

I wish the Association well in the future.

5. Treasurer's Report including membership numbers and presentation of accounts.

Membership has risen by 3 members this year.
