Notes from EMOA Meeting on 21st November 2022

The meeting was held in the Pace Room in Clifton Village.

Financial Secretary's Report - The financial secretary provided a number of statements that showed the accounts are largely on track against our budget. It was identified at the meeting that we may see more requests for funding as we have had quite a few members selected for tours and to represent the country.

Development - See Development conference report below which also covers the discussions on development at the committee meeting.

Level of Reserves - At the EMOA AGM a proposal was made that "the EMOA Committee is tasked to determine what the appropriate level of reserves should be going forward (identifying what the purpose is for having these reserves, and what they are intended to achieve)". The EMOA committee identified that there were 2 reasons for holding reserves:

- reserve for normal annual operating expenditure which would most likely include day-today development expenditure. The level of reserves to be a multiple of the annual expenditure.
- 2) reserve to cover abnormal expenditure/liability (e.g. loss of a major event).

The meeting also discussed the level of reserves that should be retained. It was felt that 3 times the annual level of expenditure (excluding the EMJOS Accounts) would be a reasonable level to maintain. The annual expenditure is around £3,500, so on that basis it was proposed that EMOA should look to retain around £10,000 in reserve (excluding EMJOS Accounts). It was proposed that this figure was reviewed on an annual basis by the committee, and that the EMOA budget should aim to move the region towards this figure.

Coaching - Hilary Palmer asked if any clubs needed members to be trained as a coach, then please let her know and she could look to arrange any necessary courses.

EMOA League 2022 - The presentation of the awards for the EMOA League 2022 will take place at NOC Strawberry Hill event on 5th March 2023.

EMOA League 2023 - There are 14 events planned for the league (though some are very provisional and may not take place) - See later in EMEWS for the list of events.

EMOA Urban League 2022 - The presentation of the awards for the EMOA Urban League will take place at DVO Dronfield event on January 2nd 2023.

EMOA Urban League 2023 - There are 8 events planned for the league (though some are still provisional) - See later in EMEWS for the list of events.

JK 2024 – It is hoped there will be more details available early in the new year, but all EMOA members are encouraged to keep the weekend free to help out as we will need all the help we can get.

Best Practice - NOC have developed a new approach called MapActive. It is based on "Couch to Green", which CLOK have developed. It uses paid Facebook advertising to attract attendees and is formed of 2 stages, Part 1 skills to > Orange standard, Part 2 > Light Green/Green standard.

Both parts comprise of 4 Face to Face weekly coaching sessions, interspersed with 1 hr online session on a Wed night with recap notes sent on afterwards. A 5^{th} activity was the NOC Shirebrook (included in fee).

Coaches have done the planning but others club members have helped at the sessions. The take up has been from 5 women for first course, we are finishing at Walesby. Time of year may have affected attendance, but NOC wanted to get started and learn as they progressed. The overall plan and online PowerPoint will be available shortly after NOC have finished stage 2. Details of MapActive are available at <u>NOC - Map Reading Course (noc-uk.org)</u>

East Midlands Development Conference – 29th October 2022

Around 18 members of the East Midlands attended the EMOA Development Conference organised by Ranald Macdonald at Rushcliffe Country Park. The meeting was split into a number of sessions which included:

Access and the Environment

Emma Monkman from British Orienteering led the initial discussions on this topic. She provided statistics on the current participation levels in British orienteering events which showed a downward trend, and the meeting discussed reasons why this could be happening. Emma also identified some of the problems of access that clubs had and talked about the new Habitat Regulation Assessment forms that most landowners will need to complete in the future (see <u>Habitats regulations assessments</u>: protecting a European site - GOV.UK (www.gov.uk)). While at first sight these appear to add more complexity for land access, Emma has been working with Natural England to ensure that when completing these forms the landowners take account of the actual impact of orienteering on the sites (like SSSIs). Working with Southampton Orienteering Club to ensure better access to the New Forest has been one result of this. So, as these HRAs are put in place for other land it may be possible to negotiate better access for orienteering. Emma is continuing to work with English Nature to ensure results of studies showing the real impact of orienteering is taken into account when access is considered.

The meeting also brainstormed other reasons that access was being limited by landowners, or why fewer areas were available (these included costs of access, SSSIs, time of year restrictions, age of officials getting older, etc.).

Other programs to increase activity are things like the Find Your Way Project (<u>www.findyourwayvo.org.uk</u>). This is using MapRun to introduce newcomers to orienteering.

Rule Changes and Fixtures

There has been an update to the BO rules (v3.10) which are available at <u>https://www.britishorienteering.org.uk/doc/competition-rules/rules-of-orienteering-v3-10</u>. The changes are highlighted at the front of the rules. Much is to do with seeding of competitors at major events.

- 1) When measuring the length of urban events, the distance measured for the course length should show the optimal distance that can be followed. (At present many events are still showing the straight-line distance). (In the current rules Appendix B section 11.6 the table is still showing recommended lengths based on straight-line distance, so it should be recognised that recommended lengths when measured by optimal distance will be longer than shown in this table). We would encourage EMOA planners and controllers to ensure this rule is applied for our urban league events.
- 2) The Midland Championships is no longer a level A event, but is treated as a level B event. This should make it slightly easier to organise (However, seeding requirements do still apply).
- 3) The requirements for controllers at level C events states that they should preferably be from another club. The requirements for controllers at level B events states that, ideally

they should be from a different Region. They must be from a different club, but that can be from a club in the same region.

4) A new rule was added in v3.10, rule 27.11 - "The start times of competitors shall not be disclosed to other competitors until entries and entry changes have closed". The rule does not state which events this applies to and potentially could apply to all levels of event. It was agreed at the EMOA committee that in EMOA we will implement our veto for this rule in regards to all level C and D events within the region.

Development Plan for EMOA

The attendees looked to brainstorm areas where we believed there should be more focus in the EMOA Development Plan.

There were a number of ideas put forward to encourage participation, but there were differences between the attendees as to what were the areas to focus on. Some folk felt more focus on training / coaching could help, while others felt it was important to have events available most weekends.

Subsequent to the conference, Ranald has produced a draft Development Plan which he circulated to the attendees and presented to the EMOA Committee meeting. Included in the Draft Development Plan is the statement "The spirit of the plan is to encourage co-operation and collaboration between clubs within EMOA to provide better value for the resources being used, the sharing of good practice and dealing with issues across clubs."

The aim would be to earmark a sum from the EMOA reserves for development activities and identify potential projects that should / could be funded out of those reserves. Ranald proposed that a representative from each EMOA club would form part of a group, along with himself as Development Co-ordinator, who would refine the Development Plan and then agree on the projects that should be funded going forward. (This is obviously going to take some time to set up and get going and does not prevent other development work from continuing in the meantime.). Once the Development Plan has been finalised it will be shared in EMEWS. The actions at the EMOA meeting were for club reps to come back to Ranald with names for their development representatives, and then Ranald would set up a session(s) with them to finalise the Development Plan and then to start reviewing proposals from the clubs for development activity.

The actual level of funds available should be based on the amount of funds in the accounts over and above the determined level of reserves. However, we should not formally identify that figure until the JK 2024 budget responsibility was clearly defined (it is felt that this will be the responsibility of British Orienteering and not EMOA, but we need to ensure this is documented before we start to commit funds to developmental activity).

- The Aspiring Elites project has now finished and we heard from the new performance pathway director, Bernie Dietzig, on their plans for the future. We will also be discussing how we could best support WOC 2024 at our next meeting.
- The Foundation are working with an undergraduate at Edinburgh University to measure the impact we are having and what aspects are the most effective to support Orienteering.
- A grant was agreed to support the JWOC to attend the rescheduled event in Portugal.
- We agreed further actions to take on the recommendations from the Newcomer Retention Group report and took early steps towards looking at Volunteering as a project.
- A report was received from a previous grant to support development in the Kingdom of Fife Orienteers club full report <u>here</u>

EMJOS Summary June to November 2022

Training:

Saturday 17th Sept: Dai Bedwell led the joint EMJOS and West Midlands Junior Squad session at Hartshill (WCH area). 5 EM juniors plus about 15 WMJS used the contour exercises to brush up their observational and O' skills after the summer break. It was also good to have a joint session to make and meet friends before the Junior Inter Regional Championships in Ireland the following week.

Zoom call preparation for the JIRCS races: 4 of the juniors joined Ant and Ann-Marie, to look at the old map of Tyrella sand dunes (previous JK area), old Route Gadget routes, Google Earth and the final details. Last minute information past on from Organisers about changes to accommodation, travel and the need to go out Saturday evening for supper.

JIRCS 2022 24th to 26th September Newcastle Northern Ireland. 9 juniors and 4 coaches/adults travelled. The juniors performed well on both the individual and relay days. Very good joint 7th position first day (combined men's and women's) individuals, with East Anglia and North East squad just 2 points behind. With final 10th position just 3 points behind East Anglia after the relays. Read the Juniors' own report (EMEWS) on what they felt about their experiences.

Allestree Park 13th November: 2 juniors and 2 adults took the challenge to practice at the local event with course maps changed to remove footpaths and cover (white-out) some of the detail. More difficult because Ann-Marie forgot to mention that there were extra controls to visit, so don't pick up the event control descriptions. But the feedback was the focus on using other liner features (veg boundaries) was good practice.

Summer JROS tour and international competitions:

Ben Squire was at the 2022 <u>European Youth Orienteering Championships</u>, held in Salgótarján, Hungary, 1 - 4 July 2022. After a tough first day on the Long course (7.7km) coming 40th (1.12:9 compared to 57:38), he had the sprint day where he came joint 32nd running 17:06, only 1:41 down on the winner. The relay placed GB a good 10th place.



Rachel Duckworth was eagerly anticipating the summer racing in Portugal at JWOC but as the heat and risk of forest fires increased to dangerous levels, the Portuguese government banned everyone from entering the forests. Therefore Part 1 in July was just the sprints. She came 87th (19:22 compared to 14:57 winners time). The Organisers then ran 2 more sprint relay races using the same village (Carapito, east of Porto).

Part 2 (3rd - 6th November) was Middle, Relay and Long distances in the forest. As she herself summed up her performance - happy with a good and steady in the Middle, very happy with the relay run passing many (team was 10th), and then the worst nightmare possible on Long: loosing her dibber in the undergrowth and retiring. But she took away from her first major international competition a lot of learning points and now looking forward to next year's competitions in the UK, Australia and New Zealand.

Ellie Simpson and Daniel Glover (LEI) both attended Lagganlia, Scotland JROS camp for M/W14. From the video (<u>https://youtu.be/a8Z1-wTBw34</u>) it looked like they had good weather and enjoyed the best technical training possible.

Selections:

Talent North, South and Scotland (M/W15 onwards) continue to develop the talent from our regional squad level to the Development (M/W19) and on to Performance Squads. We are encouraging our M/W16 and 18 juniors to aspire and seek selection to the Talent North group, which is also being assisted by coach Ant Squire.

Future EMJOS training:

Plans made to join NOC's MapActive at Burntstump has not received any takers. We have been invited to join WMJS at their Christmas session on Pooley Fields CP (near Tamworth) on Sunday 11th December. With friends in both squads I am hopeful some juniors will take this opportunity.

January 2023: an away weekend, combined with a local quality event on different terrain might be possible – access permitting.

Sunday 5th Feb 2023 Chambers Wood (near Lincoln) in conjunction with the LOG EM event, run by John Mather (EMJOS coach).

EMJOS compete at the Junior Inter Regional Championships

Friday 23rd to 25th Sept 2022, hosted by Northern Ireland

A joint report written by the Juniors.

Friday night saw our team of 9 EMJOS juniors and 4 coaches set off from East Midlands Airport, heading to Belfast for an exciting JIRCS weekend around "Tyrella" near Ballykinler military base near Newcastle Count Down.



The area posed a technical challenge with intricate contour detail and scattered gorse bushes. A tough area but EMJOS saw several well-placed runs and everyone ran with maximum effort: everyone scored points for the team: After individual runs 7th place, 10th place for relays, and overall 10th position (1st ScotJOS, 2nd Y&HJS, 3rd NWJS).

The area was tricky - there were many contour features and running was difficult. The dark green patches of spikey gorse were easy to get stuck in and hard to get out (scratches and red spots are

numerous).

The squads were woken at 6:45am and we headed for breakfast before leaving via buses to go to the event start. The area was runnable sand dunes that were far too easy to get lost in. Once we completed our runs, we all headed into Newcastle for fish & chips and pizza supper.

Losing the barrack accommodation, the weekend before the event, saw the local secondary school,



Shimna Integrated College, step in to help by providing

two sports halls (packed to the roof with army camp beds) and catering provided by the school Caretaker and friends (fresh fruit, pancakes, croissants and cereal).

The relay (Sunday) was on the same area as the individual competition, so we had a slight idea what the area and courses would be like. The mass start was unreal and we headed into the dunes where it was a short course with intricate contour

features.

Our teams had mid table results with the men's team placing 20th [Jake (3), Daniel (10), Ben (27)] and the women's placing 16th [Hannah (10), Ellie (14), Libby (15)]. The AdHoc teams came 1st [Josh (2), Eoin (1), NI runner (2)] and 2nd [SW runner, SE runner, Robyn].

On the Saturday evening we went down into town and had dinner, went to the beach (raced to touch the sea





waves) and played in an arcade. We won some sweets, a slinky, more sweets and more importantly a speaker that is quieter than our phone. Also, we got ice cream 😊.

Back at the school there was a ceilidh. It was a great way to meet people as you had to keep changing who you were dancing with.

Overall, we all had a great time and had a lot of fun orienteering in Northern Ireland, as well as enjoying the time we had together. We all did incredibly good in all the races individually and in the relay.

Junior World Orienteering Championships 2022 – Aguiar da Beira, Portugal Rachel Duckworth



During July when the original JWOC was planned there were scorching temperatures of over 40 degrees. The forests got closed due to fire warnings being high and a different schedule was

organised. The forest races were rescheduled to the autumn and took place over the first week of November. I was very fortunate to be able to travel with the team once again and compete in the 3 races – Middle, Relay and Long.

I had a mixed bag of races: one was great with bad ending; one was great all the way through, and one was terrible!

Middle distance on Quinta das Lameiras, 67^{th} . Unlike most of my teammates I had not spent much prior time in Portugal due to exams so worked really hard in the days leading up to the competition to get my head into the maps and fine tune my Portuguese orienteering. I took some great route choices with safety being my priority during the first $\frac{3}{4}$ of the course. The



terrain in these forests consisted of lots of bare rock and boulder detail, using the rock slabs as speedy directional aids. I struggled on some of the steeper exposed sections as I hadn't packed my dobs so had to put full faith in my Inov-8 graphite traction. The last section of the course was in thicker green undergrowth which made progress much slower. I wasn't looking ahead enough at the macro route choice on the ground and became stuck in multiple places, resulting in me turning around to try a different route. I lost a lot of time during these 2 controls which was very disappointing.

Relay on Quinta das Lameiras, 2nd leg, gained 7 places. In domestic relays I tend to run first leg as I enjoy the head-to-head aspect and the pressure. Due to the high calibre of the field this

head-to-head racing is still present in the 2nd and sometimes 3rd leg. I was in a pack for most of my course and it was super fun running with the 3 other girls. We started in the green, thick vegetation which I struggled with the day before, so my concentration had to be 100% right from the start and focused on safe route choices. The course was planned well and included a run-through with about 1.5km still to go. To hear the whole GB team cheering you on is a great feeling. I delivered a really clean but aggressive run; this is



probably my best race of the year and I'm super proud of myself for delivering on the biggest stage.

Long on Carapito and Eirado, DNF. Going into this race I knew it was going to be a massive effort and almost like a survival mission. I executed the first 8 controls well and was happy with my progress before the longest leg 8-9. I took a variation of one of the fastest routes but didn't analyse all aspects of it and lost quite some time. I had a small navigational error which resulted in me fighting through green once again, slowing my progress greatly! And a slight miss once in the control circle. I knew there was going to be a super long leg similar to what we received but did not prepare accordingly. On the way to number 11 my Si card got pulled off my finger by a small bush. I stopped immediately and searched for it on all the neighbouring shrubs and then on the floor in the pine needles. As I started to become frantic and lose more time the search was not improving. It would be easy to find a blue dibber in a brown forest, right? Well, I never found it. I had to jog home to the arena and retire from the long race. I was extremely disappointed in myself, and I felt it could've been prevented. That morning, a coach and I had joked I should use her dibber elastic, but I didn't want to look 'amateur'. That was an embarrassing comment! I will now forever be wearing a dibber elastic when racing...

I learnt a lot of from this week and enjoyed myself thoroughly. It was great to be back in the team and surrounded by so many enthusiastic orienteers and young people. I would like to thank EMOA and DVO for their continued support. I would also like to thank the Orienteering Foundation for the huge financial support this autumn.


