Notes from EMOA Meeting – 29th January 2024

Financial Secretary Report - In terms of income the funds from new BOF membership had started to come through, and we had event levies from 6 events (thanks to all clubs for providing levy payments from events quickly). In terms of expenditure, we had provided funds for EMJOS events, and also trophies and certificates for both the EMOA Forest and Urban Leagues. Talent payments had also been provided to a number of EMOA members.

There are no worries with regard to income and expenditure at this stage as seem to be in line with our proposed budget.

In line with the constitution Paul has been keeping historic paperwork. However, the constitution only calls for 7 years of paperwork to be retained. Paul asked for permission to destroy old paperwork more than 7 years old. The meeting agreed that Paul could do this (through a shredder).

Development - John Hurley reported on:

Officials Training Day 2024

The provisional date at this time is Saturday October 12th, and the proposed venue is Groby Community College.

The proposed courses and presenters are:

- Organisers : Chris Phillips
- Planners : Mike Gardner
- Controllers : Ranald Macdonald
- **Mapping Workshop** : David Olivant (The session will be aimed at experienced mappers, but others can attend as long as they realise this will not be a training course).

Development Projects

- Firm applications for EMOA funding -<u>None so far</u>.
- Preliminary expressions of interest DVO are also interested in a grant for starting a Map Active scheme (using similar approach to NOC). John is going to approach DVO to

get a rough draft of what they hope to do and then will liaise with NOC to see if can get a 2-club project together. He hopes then to share the approach with LOG and LEI and see if they also want to be involved.

- Club-funded development projects
 - DVO Club Development Officer. Pursuing various strategies to attract new participants, including urban Maprun events targeting running clubs.
 - NOC MapActive. Learn advanced mapreading skills applicable to a range of outdoor activities, and practice them at an orienteering event.

Coaching - The event at Shirebrook on 13th January attracted folk from NOC, DVO and LEI. It was supported by 3 NOC coaches and 1 DVO coach. It seemed to go well. Following on from Shirebrook, Hilary hopes to get a series of coaching sessions off the ground (perhaps 4 a year). The next session s hoped to be aligned to EMJOS squad in March at Shipley Park.

EMJOS - There has been no activity since November. The squad coaches are having a meeting to decide what to do in March (possibly a link with WMOA for Welsh Champs or use Shipley Park on $2^{nd}/3^{rd}$ March). There are a few new people coming through and want to encourage them.

In terms of the action for allowing clubs to merge junior teams at British and JK Relays, just after the last meeting JROS was approached by BOF to get their views on a similar proposal. Ann-Marie obviously fed back our view of allowing adjacent clubs to share juniors in these relays. It is going back to BOF and will be raised at the Events and Competitions Committee. So, at this stage Ann-Marie is awaiting further feedback to see if this will happen at this year's JK and / or British.

Update to BOF Rules - There has been a major update of the BOF rules which is available on the BOF website <u>here</u>. The change has been driven by the new British Orienteering policy (in line with that of the IOF) that men's and women's winning times should be equalised. This has had a knock-on effect in many areas and means that the 2023 edition is totally superseded by that for 2024.

- Very Short Green It was agreed that for the East Midlands Forest League in 2025 we would also include the Very Short Green class in the League. If clubs want to use the course in events this year they can do so, but the folks running the course will not count towards the EMOA League in 2024 (we have already had events and it would be unfair to add a class partway through the year).
- Very Short Hypervets Discussion took place as to whether we should also add a Very Short Hypervets class to the EMOA Urban League next year. The problem is that currently there is no definition as to what standards such a course should meet (it is not in BOF classes currently) and it is not part of the scoring system for the UK Urban League. It was agreed that we should discuss this with the UK Urban League to see if there is a demand country wide for this class, which would make it easier to implement in EMOA. Again, if clubs do want to try this course out during 2024 they could do so, but need to make folk aware it will not count towards the 2024 League.

BOF Major Events Webinar Series 2024

The BOF Major Events webinars took place on a series of 3 Monday evenings in February, each session lasting around 2 hours, and open to all level A and B controllers. There were around 80 attendees for the first session and over 60 for the following 2 sessions. If anyone wants to see them they are available on the <u>BOF Youtube channel</u>.


The first session covered the revised BOF Rules, updates to the IOF pictorial descriptions, and lessons learned from major events.

There are quite a lot of minor rule changes due to consolidation, etc. Some of the major changes are:

- Align with IOF rules to equalise men's and women's winning times for all age classes, based on M/<u>W</u>21E being 88-92 minutes.
- This has a knock-on effect of ensuring all course tables take equal women's winning times into account, thus many women's courses are now expected to run longer than before (or moved to a higher colour coded course combination in new rules). Note: This will have the most impact on many average competitors, and especially women, as now expected to run on higher category colours than may have done in previous years.
- Ensure standardisation of using International Specification for Orienteering Maps and International Specification for Sprint Orienteering Maps
- Some parts of appendices have been emboldened to show they are mandatory.
- Scaling of course ratios (which were originally set in 1995) updated to reflect 2024 winning times (for instance, some older men are winning courses in much faster mins/km than in 1995, so they have been moved to a higher colour coded course (i.e. M70 goes from Green to Short Blue)). Many women's courses impacted due to aligning to men's winning times as well (e.g. W55 goes from Green to Short Blue). So, impact is at major events the rules now show older age classes expected to run longer colour coded courses in future. Question Is this what people really want?

There are a number of minor changes but the key ones I noted that the majority of orienteers might see are:

- If the clarification symbol in column C is not sufficient to unambiguously define the placement of the control flag then the feature is not suitable for a control site.
- Use of Copse symbol extended to include a more runnable area of trees surrounded by thicker forest (see image on right). (In past a copse has only been an area of woodland in an open area).
- Use of Building symbol extended to include a pillar supporting a roof.
- New symbol added for a Railway or tramway.
- Use of Top and Beneath symbols extended to include the Upper or Lower of two levels (more for urban events).
- New symbol added for a map flip (turn the map over). See below (this was used at East Midlands Champs for the longer courses).



The third part of the session was some lessons learned from major events. The following were some of the key points that contributed to the success of major events:

- Good/great weather, centre, courses, map, 'team'
- Effective communications (across teams at event, and with all third parties)
- Having deputies for Planner and Controller
- Mentoring a potential Level A Controller
- Courses ready ~7 months before event
- Liaison with landowners, police, council etc

Some areas of problems identified were:

- Later-than-ideal appointment of key officials (ensure have a timeline agreed and meetings scheduled with key officials well in advance)
- Key officials may have limited capacity (work/other events/holidays)
- Too much Lastminute.com...
- Permissions (it is suggested you have a person who has this as their sole responsibility)
- Starts (have not been set up on time, start officials making decisions compromising the event)

The second session covered planning for older competitors, relay planning and quick wins for level A events.

The meeting was given a lot of recent major event courses and provided with the times taken by all competitors on that course (one problem with this was that the times were not broken out to only show the older competitors times as a course might also include W16, so the graphs could be misleading). The graphs did show that at a lot of events there were some very long



times for older competitors. So, the meeting discussed what should be considered when planning for older competitors. The following were some of the thoughts:

- We should not dumb down the course, a competitor still wants a challenge. Ideally try to provide a mix of leg lengths as would do for other courses.
- Avoid height climb, especially steep slopes, both up and down (also consider getting in and out of features like ditches, depressions, etc.)
- Avoid rough ground where possible
- High stiles can be difficult for older competitors
- If a young planner and controller, maybe they should make sure they have an older competitor to advise them
- Eyesight can mean reading a map is more difficult (be flexible about map scales to improve visibility)
- Long walks to start / finish has more impact on older competitors (and if these walks are only 1 person wide this can cause older competitors to feel they are in the way of younger ones trying to jog to the start).
- The ratio of times taken between fastest and slowest competitors is greater for older competitors.

One concern I had was that the points made were all valid, but the graphs had not taken account of junior competitors, and nobody had actually approached the older competitors directly to get their views on the courses we were asked to analyse. Winners routes had been provided but maybe we need to talk more to the "average" competitor to get their views.


The table below illustrates the course rules for long distance events and for major events which classes are now recommended for that colour course (I have omitted the B and short classes for clarity) (those classes in red have moved up to a longer colour, those in blue down to a shorter colour):

The other thing that I noticed was that there seemed to be a major discrepancy in the first session we were told that the new rules are going to increase winning times for older competitors, yet in the discussions of senior orienteer planning (see session 1) the concern is we have a lot of older competitors out for a very long time. So if we do have this problem, why are we lengthening the times for these competitors at major events?


In terms of relay planning, a number of topics were covered including what types of gaffling



were recommended (Gaffling is the way that relay runners run different controls but ensure all teams visit the same controls). For the junior competitors then no gaffling may be appropriate, but for others the recommendation was that relay races are meant to encourage head-to-head racing and so some gaffling would be the preferred approach, and the last few legs could be ungaffled to provide good head-to-head racing. (I would be

interested in other folks views on this as my thought was orienteering was about navigation and I would have thought frequent gaffling was more appropriate!).

Also considered was the location of controls. Below are two example maps. The first shows 3 controls all very close together (assuming



r (assuming they were on different gaffled



legs). The problem with this set of controls is that they are all in the same area very close together, so if you follow another competitor, and they had started a different gaffle then you would not lose much time as would have been led into the correct area anyway.

The second map segment shows 3 legs, but the problem with this is that competitors going to control 1A have much more climb (in and out of control) and so are likely to be left behind when compared to competitors going to 1B or 1C. While overall all teams would run each leg, those on

1A could get dropped from the leaders and lose the ability to compete head-to-head with other competitors. Ideally you need to keep the legs of the gaffles similar but controls far enough apart so if you follow someone into wrong control, you won't find yours very close by.

Other things considered were arena design (ensure competitors have good line of sight of their previous runners coming in), where the finish punches should be (for legs 1 and 2 this should be before they handover, for leg 3 after the finish line), and the labelling of maps (ideally ensure the control code is alongside the number on the map for relays, using Purple Pen can also now generate individual maps to show team number and leg and have that displayed to the competitor as they pick up the map).

What makes a good event was also considered. Things like what makes a memorable major event. The key things were to get the big things right (maps, controls, courses, results) but also make sure there is a good arena to generate an atmosphere, get the pre-event details out as early as possible (so competitors know how far away start and finish are), understand how to deal with problems (have competent people at key places like Start), signage should be clear.

The third session covered what happens if your event is made a World Ranking Event (WRE) and also looking at some scenarios that might come up at events to a jury. One thing that was mentioned was that the jury (only really applicable for level B events and above) can have multiple members of the same club, but that the jury should not really discuss with the organiser / planner and controller what their initial response is to a protest made by a competitor (i.e. the organiser should not really discuss the initial response to a protest with the jury be called in; the jury members should not really discuss the initial response to a protest with the competitor).

In terms of a WRE event the main impact is that this normally requires a panel of event advisors to be appointed (ideally international). The BOF Rules have been deliberately written to comply with IOF Rules so in terms of rules there are not major differences for the event itself.

In terms of the jury scenarios that were discussed the main points discussed were to do with competitors crossing "uncrossable" features. When do you alter the results? How should you respond?

- If a member of the public says someone crossed an uncrossable wall, could you do anything about it, with no details of the competitor?
- What, if after the event, you look on route gadget and see the winner has shown they have crossed the uncrossable wall?
- What, if after the event, many competitors are shown as having taken this route?

One thing discussed was whether routes, particularly in urban events, that might mislead a competitor to take a route to a dead end are "fair". There seemed to be a lot of thought that we should not plan to include this sort of option (personally I am not sure I agree with this!!).

East Midlands League 2024




