# EMOA Committee Meeting Report - September 25th 2006

Meeting with the BOF Chairman and Chief Executive - Neil Cameron and Mike Hamilton attended the meeting and it was agreed to put the first part of the meeting aside to discuss a variety of topics. As discussion was proving very useful this time was extended to over 90 minutes of useful brainstorming and conversation. Below I have tried to cover some of the more interesting topics that came up. Please feel free to send your views on these discussions back to me and I'll forward them to the committee.

Neil and Mike started by talking about some of the things they would like to see moved forward on:

- Implement the new membership proposals as smoothly as possible.
- Improve the accountability of BOF with improved clarity and openness of decision making. Are there ways we can increase involvement by better ways of running AGMs, reports, minutes, etc.
- Look at how to better support the volunteers who run events how can be better skill them, how can they be recognised?
- How can BOF better assist clubs? Can we get more clubs achieving the Club mark scheme? Can we have a better definition of how BOF can better assist clubs and ease their workload?
- Look at the environmental impact of orienteering. Not so much at events but can
  we take orienteering to people more, reducing the travelling required.

After some discussion around these points we moved on to talk about the vision of orienteering going forward. The updated vision follows later in EMEWS. This lead to a lot of discussion about how to achieve this, but the fundamental approach will be to provide a starter vision and ask members to expand on it.

Discussion moved on to talking around how we could increase participation in committees (BOF, Regions and Clubs). As was pointed out, many of the senior posts in BOF are self-appointed as no-one else is willing to stand so many posts get elected unopposed at the BOF AGM. Maybe we ought to look at the inhibitors that prevent people volunteering. Is it possible to reduce the time taken up by committees (do things outside committees more, use technology to discuss things before the formal meetings, etc.)? In terms of clubs it is often difficult to get people to volunteer to help at events. This is often because orienteering clubs are event facilitators with no central sense of belonging.

Should clubs look to provide different forms of structure. Can committee meetings be replaced by smaller work groups? Can we have quarterly open meetings to involve the club? Some clubs already do this sort of thing. Is there a way of sharing this best practice and passing on to other clubs?

We then had a lot of discussion around where we should be taking orienteering. We often have to compete with other sports who have a central focus and take place at a

given venue the same time each week. We can't attract kids as they tend to come once, enjoy it, but next week are taking part in some other sport and by the time of the next orienteering event, they are involved in the other sport with it's regular activity. Why can't we provide regular (weekly) local events? They could be one person events, low key, but they may start to attract a new audience. It may be that clubs over a wide geography need to set up one for each major conurbation.

Should we also look at other ways of increasing participation on a local basis? Can we map towns, parks, etc. and create more regular local programs of events aimed at those who don't want to travel? Can we produce do-it-yourself orienteering so that a person who works in an office can decide they want to have a quick run at lunchtime. They say the time they want to spend, and the area, and the computer randomly creates a course for them. This could use permanent courses, and a small charge could be made to use the facility (if necessary).

This sounds like a lot more work, but does it need to be? Keep the events simple. Just one or two people. Even if run one a week for 4 or 5 months, could use just 20 different people to set them up. As we discussed it, people agreed that often some of their favourite events had been low key events. Especially when new members were starting, having a regular series of very local events gets people involved. It gives them a sense of being part of a something. They are more likely to get involved themselves.

This does not necessarily mean a reduction in district and regional events, but what is the difference nowadays. The main factor that everyone seems to like about regional events is the ability to compete against your peers in the same age class. Why not apply this to district events as well? Most events are computerised and appear on the internet. Couldn't we provide another view of the results by age class? Could we even integrate these in to the ranking system in some way? It was agreed that EMOA would look in to the possibility of creating alternative results for district events and see what the feeling was.

None of this was intended to stop orienteers travelling to major events on top quality terrain. Many would still want to do that on a regular basis. But could we bring in more participants at the local level as well as having these major events?

There was a lot of energy in the room and people enjoyed standing back and discussing some more radical ideas. The time seemed to fly by. But when does this happen normally? Committee meetings tend to get bogged down in minutiae. Can clubs, regions and BOF committees look to schedule regular brainstorming as part of an agenda? Take time out from the minutiae and look to the future.

What do you all think about some of these ideas?

The rest of the East Midlands meeting was shorter than usual, so these are brief notes of some of the additional topics covered:

**EMOA AGM Quorate** - We had (just) enough members at the AGM to be quorate so there was no need to hold an additional meeting. The minutes are enclosed with this EMEWS elsewhere.

**EMOA Secretary** - We are short of a secretary after the AGM. Below is part of a description of the role as defined by the previous incumbent - The person filling this role has the opportunity to make a valuable contribution to the organisation of the sport at a Regional level in a variety of ways, not least by helping the business of the Association to run effectively and efficiently. The post brings the holder into contact with members of other clubs who are also making a contribution at this level in the sport and gives a broader view of the organisation of the sport at both Regional and National level. The post provides valuable experience for those who would aspire to higher office within the Region or within the National Body, as well as those who wish to contribute towards their sport in a different way from the usual volunteering roles at events.

We need someone to fill this role urgently. According to the constitution, as the Chairman and Treasurer are both from DVO, the secretary cannot be from that club.

**Local Membership** - It was also proposed that all Clubs in the Region are to encourage all 'new' BOF 'Local members' to have, from  $1^{st}$  September 2006 to  $31^{st}$  December 2007, free membership of EMOA so that they will get EMEWS for between 12 and 16 months without needing to pay the £3.00 annual fee - the intention is to encourage them to take up full BOF National Membership, or at the very least, take up of EMOA membership from  $1^{st}$  January 2008 - a snip at only £3.00! So those of you receiving EMEWS for the first time may now know why!

Fixtures - The Midland Nights now has a controller.

The date of the Midland Championships had lead to some correspondence between the West Midlands Fixtures secretary and Ian, our Fixtures Secretary. West Midlands were concerned that in some cases it is possible that as the Midland Championships moves around the calendar a winner may only hold the trophy for a couple of months (if they win in the Autumn and the next Championship is in the Spring). They wanted to propose a fixed date for the Championships and suggested the Autumn. EMOA do not feel this is feasible as in many cases we want the best areas for the Midland Champs and they are only available at certain times of year (shooting, birds, braken, etc.). It is unfortunate, but we propose the region picks it's most appropriate area whenever that is.

DVO's National Event in December 2007 is well underway and organisers have been appointed. The planner and controller were already in place.

LEI propose their C3 for Belvoir on  $14^{th}$  March 2010 be upgraded to C2 status. This needs to be supported by the region. LEI were given a provisional OK to this proposal to allow further access discussions. Clubs to consult and report back.

Agreed clubs should move forward re organisation of British Sprint Champs at Nottingham University and British Middle Distance Champs at Grace Dieu in 2009.

Veteran Home International 2009: EMOA responsible for organising this event. LEI have a C3 planned in October 2009 which could be used but referred to Clubs for offers of events.

# A vision for British Orienteering - a consultation process

### Introduction and summary

At a recent meeting, the Council decided that it would be beneficial to develop a vision for British Orienteering.

Council also decided that there should be wide consultation with the membership and a range of methods is being employed to do that, including this circular, which is being sent to all of British Orienteering's Constituent Associations and Clubs.

You are asked to discuss this document in your Association or Club and send us feedback, preferably by e-mail to vision@britishorienteering.org.uk, although written communications sent to the British Orienteering office will also be welcome.

As we are anticipating a considerable volume of feedback, we do not plan to reply to each submission. Instead, we will publish a summary of the feedback received.

We would like your feedback as soon as possible, but certainly by 15 December 2006.

# What is a vision, and why should we have one for British Orienteering?

A vision is a way of articulating in a reasonably concise way the situation we would like the sport to be in at the end of, say, the next 10 years. The vision enables us to decide the priorities of possible action programmes: if a particular action programme does not support or enable the vision, or in some way clearly move us toward the vision, that programme will be given a much lower priority.

This ability to set priorities is especially necessary where our resources, human and financial, are limited, as they currently are.

In addition, this means that the vision must be stated carefully, as otherwise things we would like to do could wrongly be made a low priority or not done at all.

Since the vision is setting out in summary where we would like our sport to be in the future, it can act as a way of encouraging greater team work and co-operation as we work together to achieve the vision.

Having a vision can also be important in gaining support from outside the sport, as it tells organisations, companies or people that this is a sport which has thought about where it's going, and is keen to make progress.

The vision could be in many formats, but would usually be written as text, ideally reasonably briefly, so that it can be easily understood, and is "approachable".

If the vision is also inspirational, that can be helpful, as it may well at a later stage encourage support from people not involved in its formulation.

### What might the vision contain?

Since the vision is about where we want to be, as opposed to where we are, it should usually reflect desired change, unless there needs to be significant work to maintain the current status, but can contain elements which are already mostly achieved if thought important enough.

An example might be the age range of orienteers: we would probably justifiably feel that orienteering was already practised by all ages of participant, so, unless that was under threat, it might not figure in the vision. However, if we saw that it was important to increase significantly the proportion of participants aged between 20 and 40, we might reflect that in the vision statement. We could also keep eg "Practised by all ages" in the vision if it was a vital part of the vision we wanted to communicate.

There seems to be support for including these three areas in the vision:

- 1. The size of British orienteering (number of participants) [eg 20,000 regular orienteers; it should be possible to determine a target when the results of the 2007 Membership Scheme are known.]
- 2. Whether orienteering is growing in popularity in Britain [eg orienteering was growing (eg 10%) year by year]
- 3. What the public profile of orienteering is [eg widespread and accurate understanding of the basic concept of orienteering; whether orienteering was recognised as a sport offering an enjoyable mental and physical challenge, at elite level comparable with more widely practised sports; how well run the sport is; whether orienteering is a leader in environmental matters; etc]

Some possible areas that could also appear in the vision might include:

- 4. Whether international success at competitive level is important [eg British athletes regularly in the top 10 in the world in all age categories]
- 5. Whether there is a structure that encourages everyone to improve their skills and have fun from their participation [eg skills development pathways]
- 6. What the status and recognition of those who helped run orienteering is [eg most participants active as volunteers]
- 7. Whether orienteering is a culture where people's welfare is considered [eg risks well managed, including those arising from Child protection issues]
- 8. Whether orienteering events create a welcoming environment to all [eg events held where they are accessible, variety of type of event, age classes etc].
- 9. Whether orienteering is a sport that offered an enjoyable mixture of physical exercise and social interaction [eq post-event social opportunities available]

It can be a real challenge to decide which direction we want to go in, or at least what the priorities are, and then to express them succinctly. However, it can pay huge dividends in enabling us to focus on a clear direction for the sport, and gain momentum as we see progress being made towards the vision.

### What format should your feedback take?

To try and make it easier for you to give feedback and for us to review it, it is suggested that your feedback be in four sections (you can choose to feedback in one, two, or any number of these sections) as follows:

- A. Whether you agree that dimensions 1-3 above should figure in the vision.
- B. Which dimensions (if any) to the vision you would propose other than those listed as 1-9 above.
- C. Which of the dimensions 4-9 (or more as suggested in B.) you feel should figure in the vision.
- D. What comments you have about the example vision shown below. You might even wish to propose something!

### Example vision

**Orienteering** - a sport widely understood and highly regarded for its physical and mental challenges and its care for the environment; a growing sport that is accessible and attractive to all.

# BOF Mapping Conference

This year's map conference was held at Longmoor army camp, near Petersfield in Hampshire on  $21^{st}$  and  $22^{nd}$  October. About 25 mappers took part, many relatively inexperienced. Delegates awoke early both mornings to the sound of ATC cadets being drilled in the rain.

Saturday morning was a surveying exercise on part of the Woolmer map with the theme being generalisation. The aim was show that it is better to simplify the map and only use significant features of importance to the runner to maintain the clarity of the map.

The Saturday afternoon technical session was led by Bruce Bryant of OD. At the last conference two years ago we discovered that GPS was not yet accurate enough for orienteering mapping. Since December 2005 two European Galileo satellites have increased the accuracy of GPS down to an acceptable level of about three metres and OCAD 9 has additional GPS functionality that makes it easy to transfer data to OCAD surveys. Beware however, OCAD is set up to work particularly with one model, the Garmin eTrex, and in any case is still not accurate in wooded areas as the signals bounce off the trees causing shadows.

Bruce then gave a demonstration of how to use material from the internet, map bases and air photographs, to set up the bases for surveying. These combined with GPS input where appropriate should improve the accuracy of maps in the future.

On Saturday evening Rod Postlethwaite gave a session on OCAD hints and tips with everyone picking up ideas, even Rod and other Map Group members.

Allan Farrington is based at Longmoor and has acquired the accommodation used for the conference. This serves as a base for the British Army Orienteering club and was well stocked with oranges. However, tea bags were running short by Sunday morning and breakfast saw a raid by the mappers on the mess to replenish supplies. No casualties.

Pauline Olivant gave a presentation on the BOF School Mapping specifications on Sunday morning. These were developed in 2005 to provide consistency for school maps and to meet the demand for advice and guidance. Pauline also showed how school maps were used to coach children; this was quite new to many there who had not appreciated the way these maps are used to develop skills. When we developed the specifications, one mapping challenge was to find a way to show the many different features found in school grounds while keeping close to the existing specifications. After a year in the wild all involved are pleased with the way the specifications have been accepted.

Everyone agreed that the weekend had been very useful and left enthused to produce more and better maps.

I would love to repeat the whole experience.

If there are any juniors reading this who think that they would like to be in the team next year - keep on orienteering and training and in the spring of 2007 come along and compete in the Regional Champs and other local events. It is not unknown for 12s and even 10s to run for the EM team and next year the competition will be just up the M1 in south Yorkshire on the weekend 23/24 June.

I knew that if I had a good run at Oban then I might get onto Glenmore but it was touch and go. I looked at old maps of the area that the event would be on and I really focused on what I was doing. By doing this I did quite well at this event, this meant that I was in with a chance of going to Glenmore.

I had no idea when the selections were coming out, but one day my sister found them on the Internet. When I found out I had got into Glenmore I was so happy! However I still wish that I had done that bit better at the selection races and then maybe just maybe I would have got onto the Halden tour!

- (e) Thanks to Andy Portsmouth for staging the street 'O' event prior to the AGM. This was won by Roger Edwards, who will organise the event for next year.

### 4. Secretary's report

EMOA had 363 members (a decrease in 5 Senior and 3 family members. We have a total of 44 controllers at the various Grades (decrease of 1). No Regional conferences for controllers, planners were held - had anticipated that WMOA would stage them. There were 13 coaching courses at Level 1. Two have attended coaching course at level 2 and have almost qualified. Derbyshire have a new community sports coach in orienteering and much new coaching development is going on in LEI

### 5. Treasurer's report and approval of Balance Sheet and Income & Expenditure Statement

There was a surplus of nearly £500 compared with a forecast loss. This was mainly as a result of a mid year change to the SI equipment accounting. In future some equipment will be bought each year and will not depreciate the equipment over five years. So there is no need to charge for depreciation, this effectively saves £1,000 each year. In view of this reduction and the healthy SI fund there is a proposed reduction in the SI levy for 2007.

The other unusual factor in the accounts relate to JIRC, the last bit of income - £390 of funds from BOF came in July and the final 40% of the expenditure was made in the current financial year. The balance was transferred to Association funds and in recognition of the efforts made was paid out to Nottinghamshire Schools Orienteering Association.

Membership is falling so that membership income is dropping too. Event levy income is being sustained but part of this is due to the increased rate of levy from January 2006. SI hire income is being sustained; this year only one dibber was recorded as lost. Income was higher than previous years owing to the sponsorship of the League, unfortunately no replacement sponsor has been found.

On the junior side, income and expenditure is similar to last year. The grant of £392 from Nottinghamshire County Council is welcomed but this is its final year.

No conference for planners and controllers was held and the cost of awards to support juniors was low.

Moving to the balance sheet, this is very healthy. The accumulated fund is the buffer against bad times and this provides the Association with a very considerable safety margin. The SI fund is also larger than required as we were fortunate to buy second hand equipment and therefore we did not pay as much as originally estimated. This leaves a balance sufficient to replace all the old equipment and nearly all the dibbers.

The accounts for the year, having been circulated, were accepted.
